A comparison of Joe Bloggs writing from 3 July to 2 December 2018.

How students were tested

Students were given an initial test on the 3 July 2018 with the topic 'The Key'.

They were then taught the Seven Steps for 22 weeks (including breaks and holidays) before being retested under the same conditions, with the topic 'The Key'.

Teachers marked the first and second writing task using the Seven Steps marking rubric which contains seven criteria, each marked from 0 to 7.
