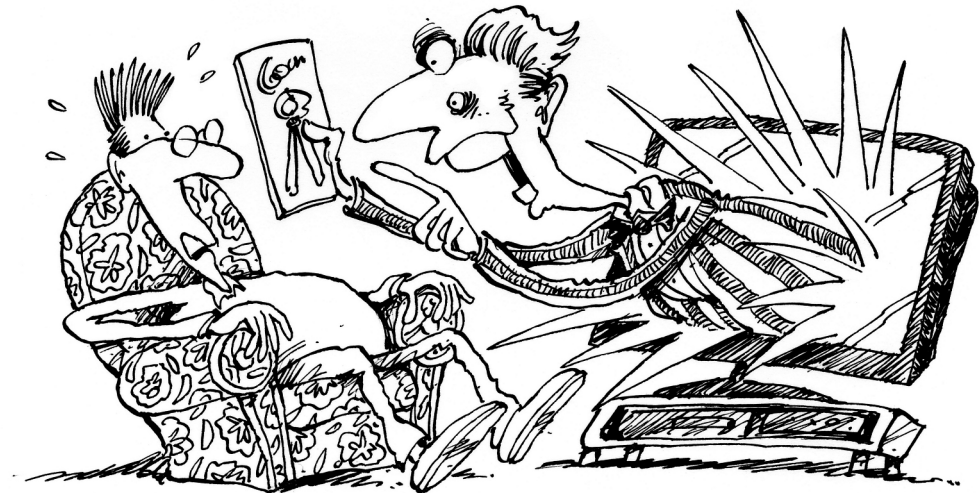
Step 1: Plan for Success

Animations and Advertisements on the Story Graph

One of the best ways to learn is to see examples, like these story graphs.

How to use them:

- Explore favourite stories and how they work
- Look for moments of tension (the pebble, rock and boulder)
- Compare the many ways stories start and end
- Inspire students to create their own story graphs!



There are many more sets of story graphs available, covering books with themes from friendship and belonging to sustainability and First Nations histories and cultures, as well as secondary texts. Members can find them on *Teacher Hub*.

The Greatest Gift

Sizzling Start

The advertisement starts at a moment of change: A snowflake leads us immediately into a household where an alarm clock goes off and Dave is in a rush to get to work.

Backfill

WHO: Dave.
WHAT: Dave is overworked and is missing time with his family.
WHERE: Dave's work and home.

Pebble (Small problem)

Dave is late for work and everything is hectic because it's Christmas time!

Rock (Medium problem)

He wants to find the greatest gift for his family, but he doesn't have time to breathe.

Boulder

(Main tension scene)
Dave realises that he doesn't have time because there is only ONE of him!

Exciting Ending

(Action climax)
Dave creates clones of himself so he can have more time with his family. He gives them the greatest gift – HIM!

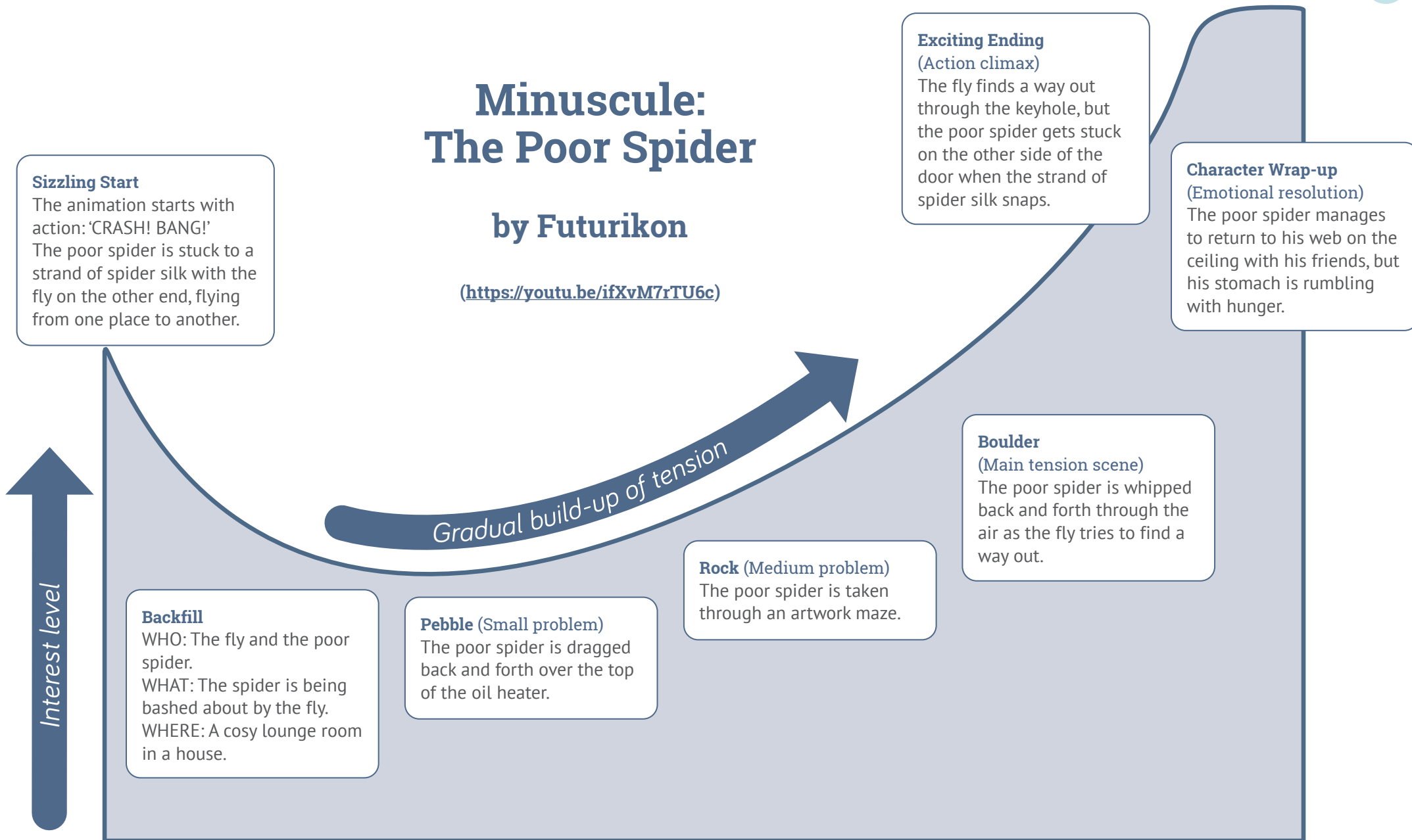
Character Wrap-up

(Emotional resolution)
Dave can now get everything done and spend time with his family, which makes everyone happy.

Minuscule: The Poor Spider

Sizzling Start

The animation starts with action: 'CRASH! BANG!'
The poor spider is stuck to a strand of spider silk with the fly on the other end, flying from one place to another.

Backfill

WHO: The fly and the poor spider.
WHAT: The spider is being bashed about by the fly.
WHERE: A cosy lounge room in a house.

Pebble (Small problem)

The poor spider is dragged back and forth over the top of the oil heater.

Rock (Medium problem)

The poor spider is taken through an artwork maze.

Boulder

(Main tension scene)
The poor spider is whipped back and forth through the air as the fly tries to find a way out.

Exciting Ending

(Action climax)
The fly finds a way out through the keyhole, but the poor spider gets stuck on the other side of the door when the strand of spider silk snaps.

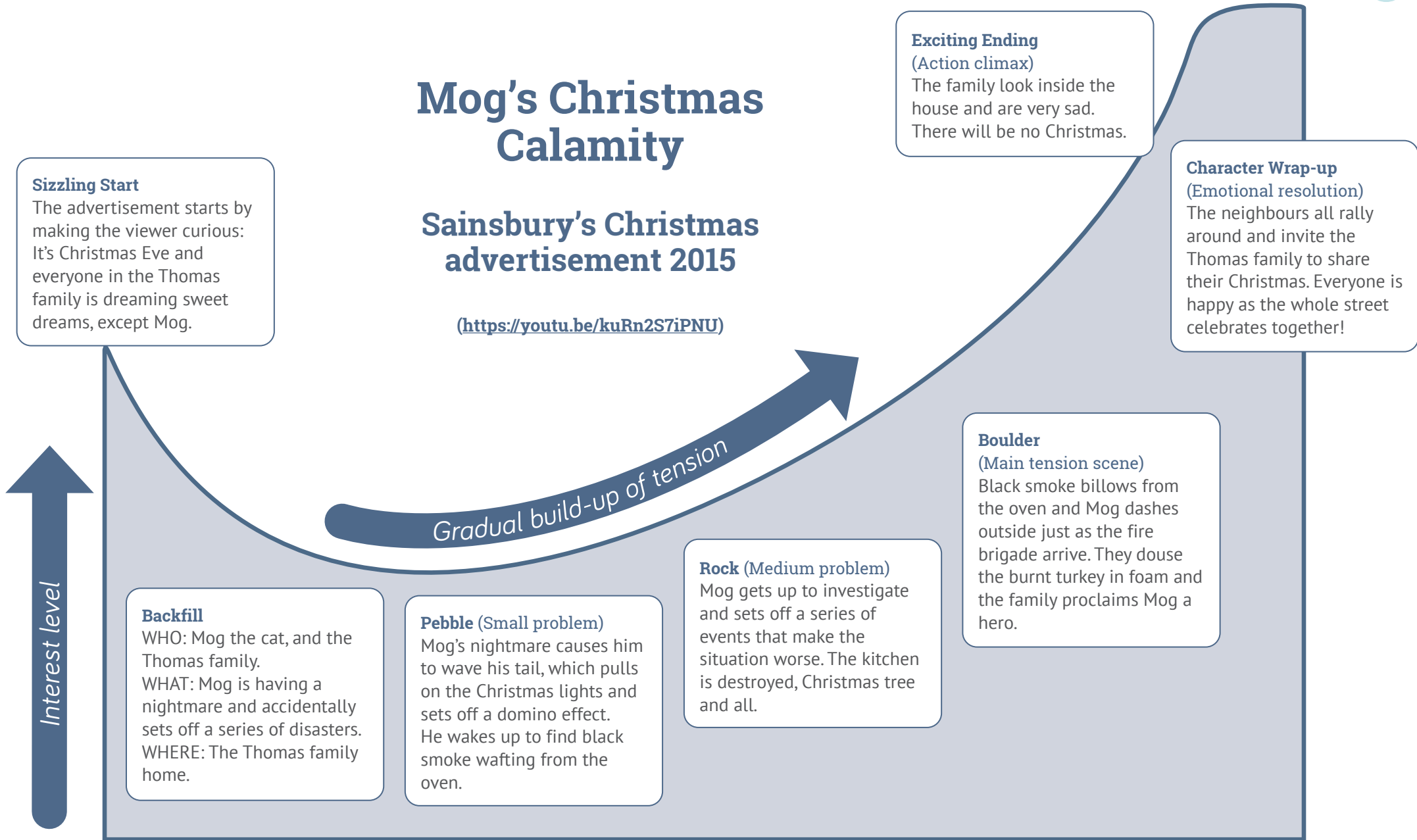
Character Wrap-up

(Emotional resolution)
The poor spider manages to return to his web on the ceiling with his friends, but his stomach is rumbling with hunger.

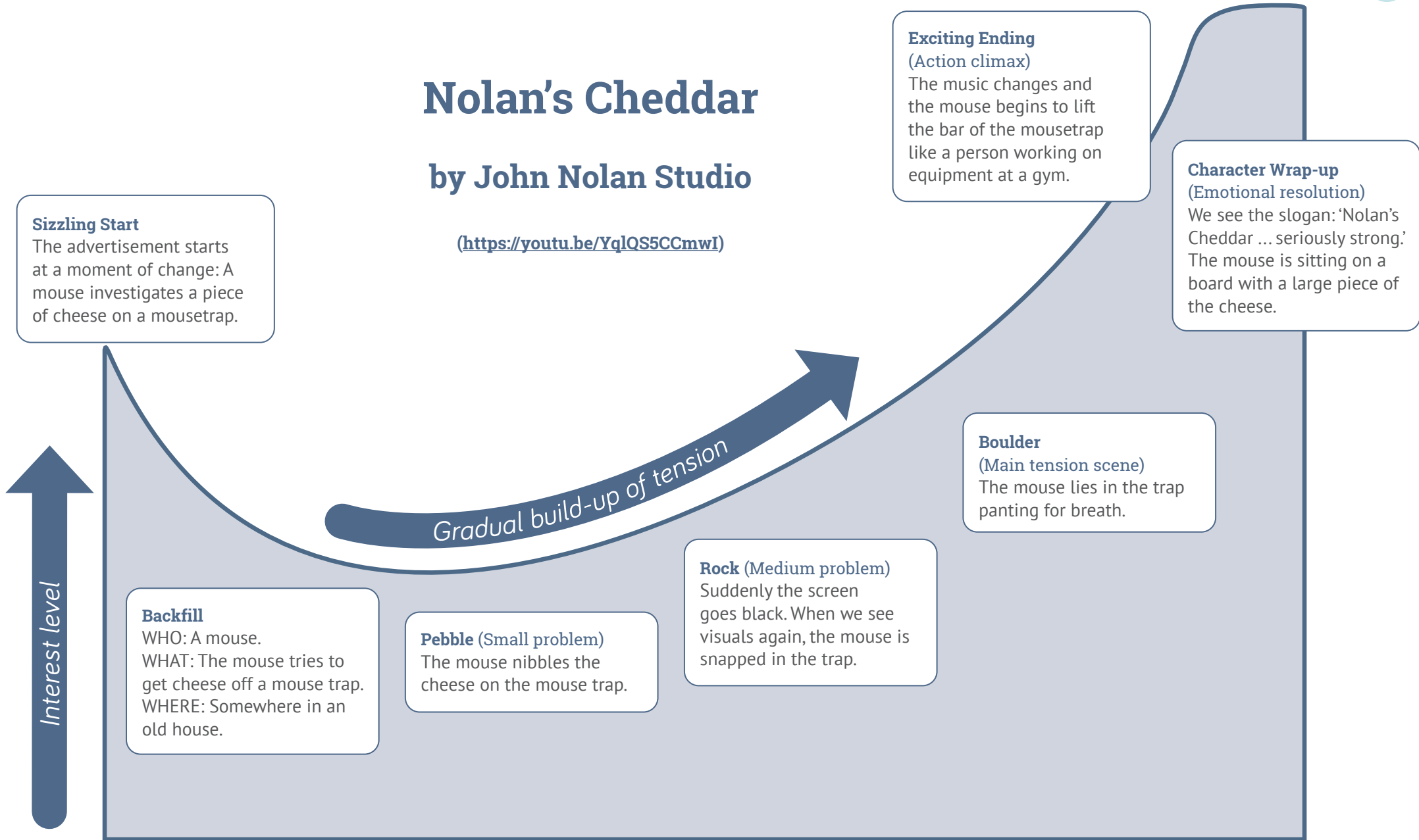

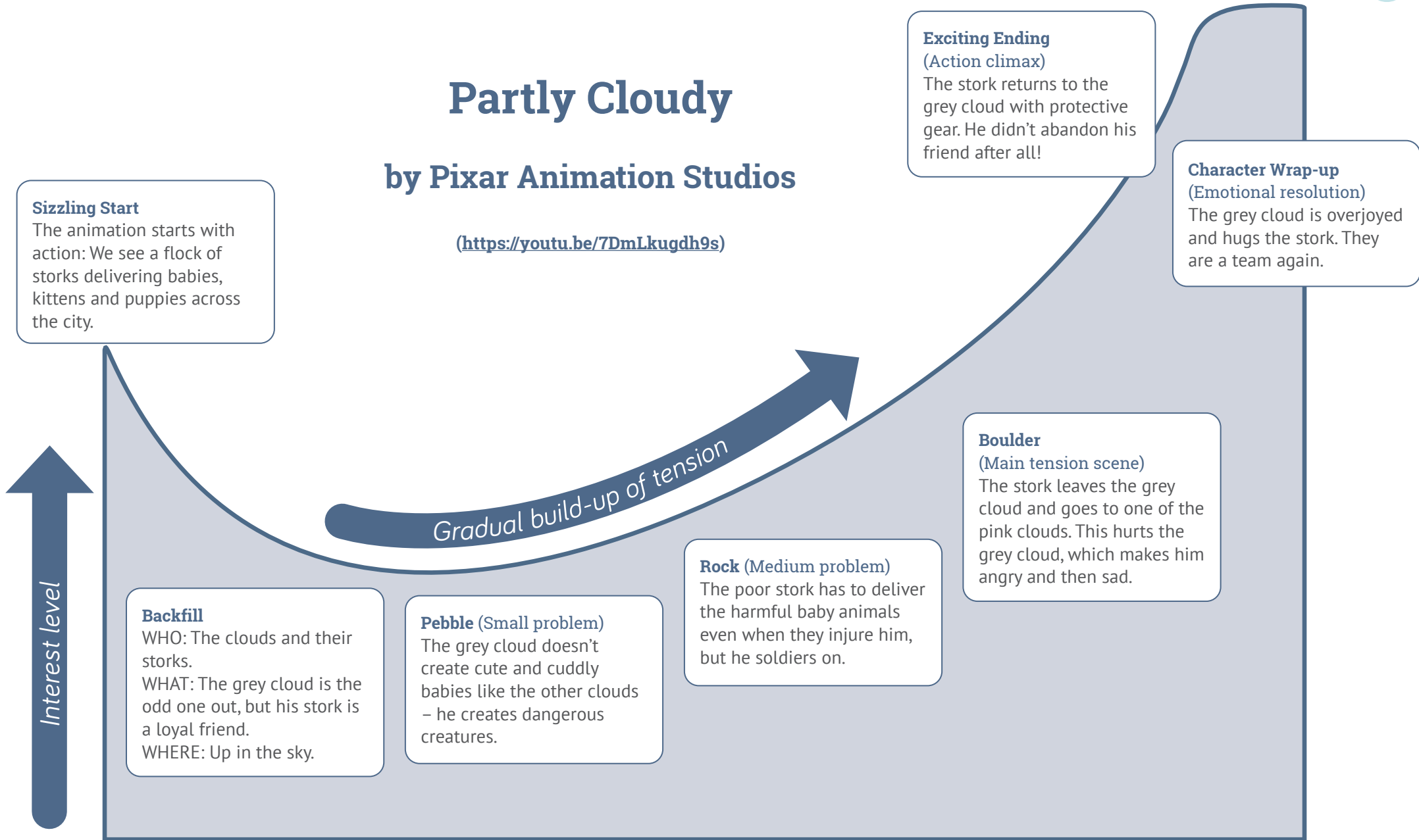

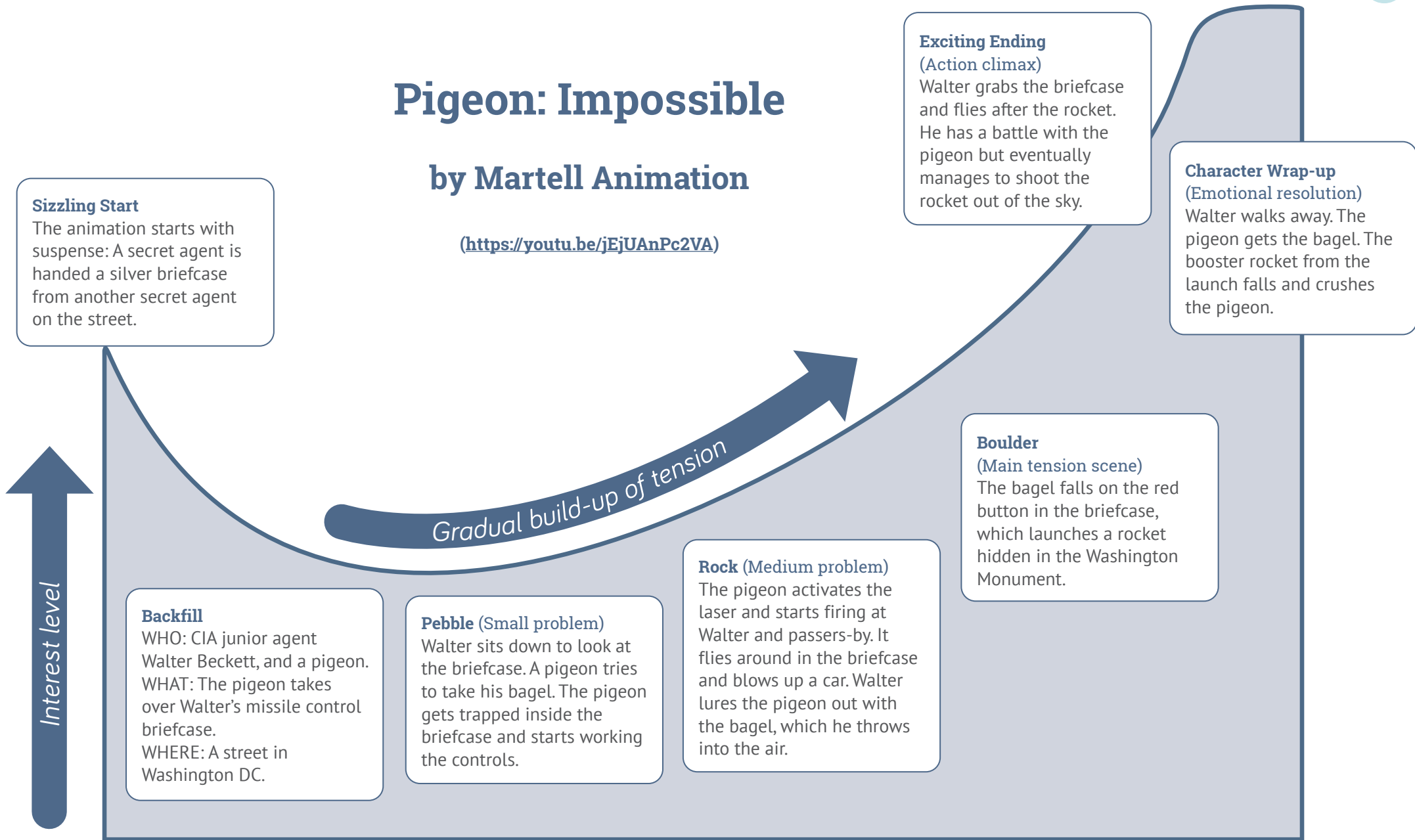

Sizzling Start

The animation starts with suspense: A secret agent is handed a silver briefcase from another secret agent on the street.

Backfill

WHO: CIA junior agent Walter Beckett, and a pigeon.
WHAT: The pigeon takes over Walter's missile control briefcase.
WHERE: A street in Washington DC.

Pebble (Small problem)

Walter sits down to look at the briefcase. A pigeon tries to take his bagel. The pigeon gets trapped inside the briefcase and starts working the controls.

Rock (Medium problem)

The pigeon activates the laser and starts firing at Walter and passers-by. It flies around in the briefcase and blows up a car. Walter lures the pigeon out with the bagel, which he throws into the air.

Exciting Ending

(Action climax)
Walter grabs the briefcase and flies after the rocket. He has a battle with the pigeon but eventually manages to shoot the rocket out of the sky.

Character Wrap-up
(Emotional resolution)

Walter walks away. The pigeon gets the bagel. The booster rocket from the launch falls and crushes the pigeon.

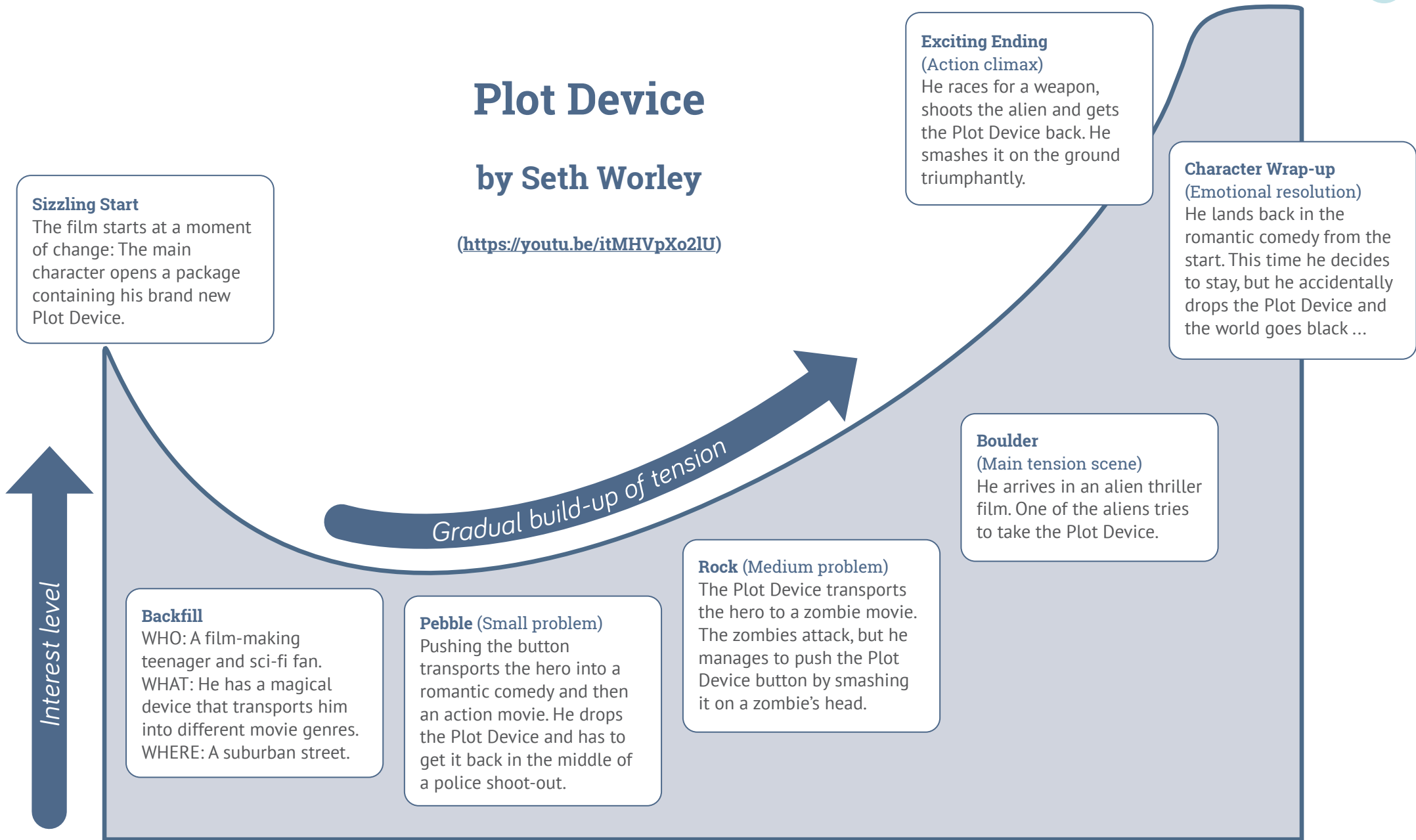
Boulder

(Main tension scene)
The bagel falls on the red button in the briefcase, which launches a rocket hidden in the Washington Monument.

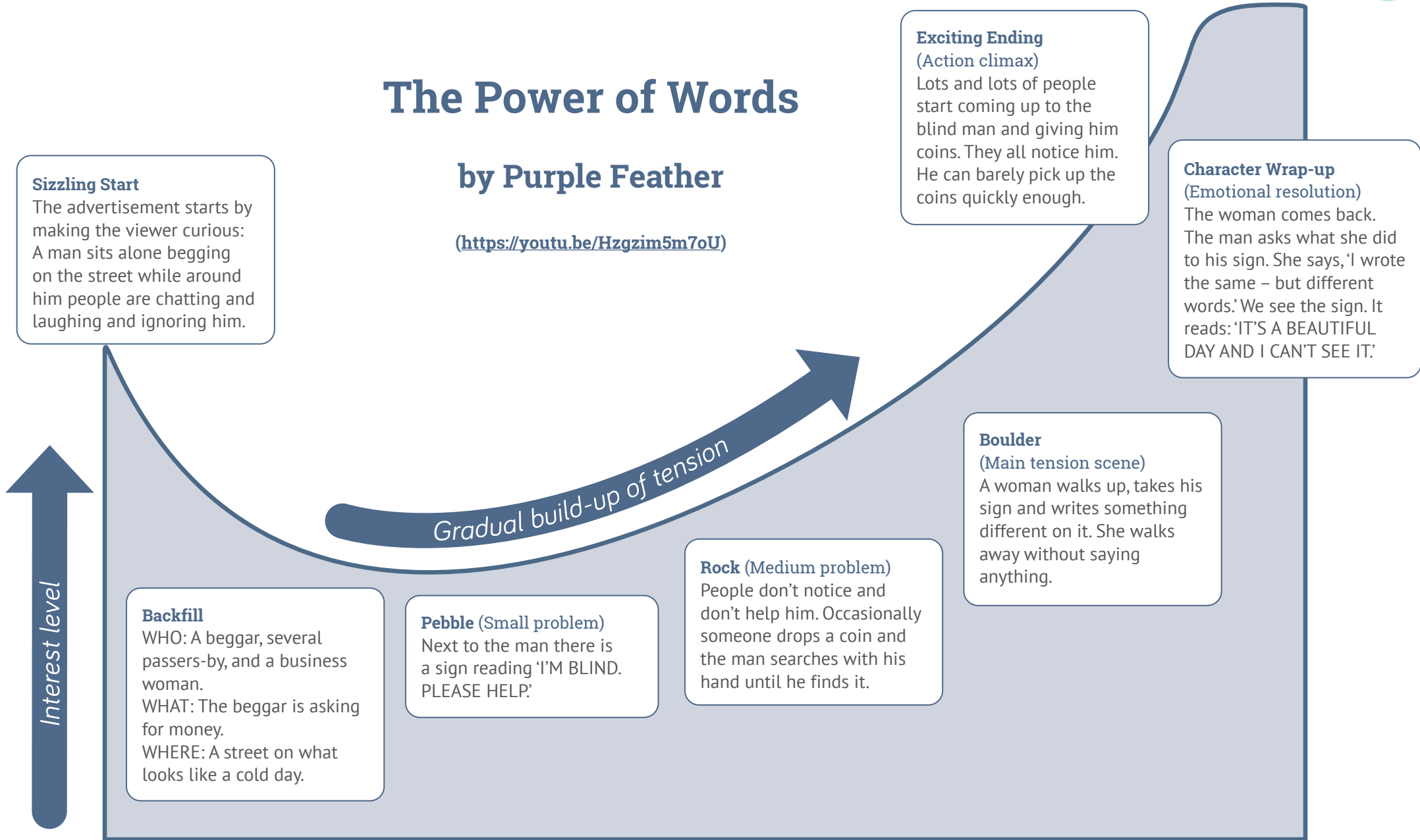

Sizzling Start
The advertisement starts by making the viewer curious: A man sits alone begging on the street while around him people are chatting and laughing and ignoring him.

Backfill
WHO: A beggar, several passers-by, and a business woman.
WHAT: The beggar is asking for money.
WHERE: A street on what looks like a cold day.

Pebble (Small problem)
Next to the man there is a sign reading 'I'M BLIND. PLEASE HELP.'

Rock (Medium problem)
People don't notice and don't help him. Occasionally someone drops a coin and the man searches with his hand until he finds it.

Boulder (Main tension scene)
A woman walks up, takes his sign and writes something different on it. She walks away without saying anything.

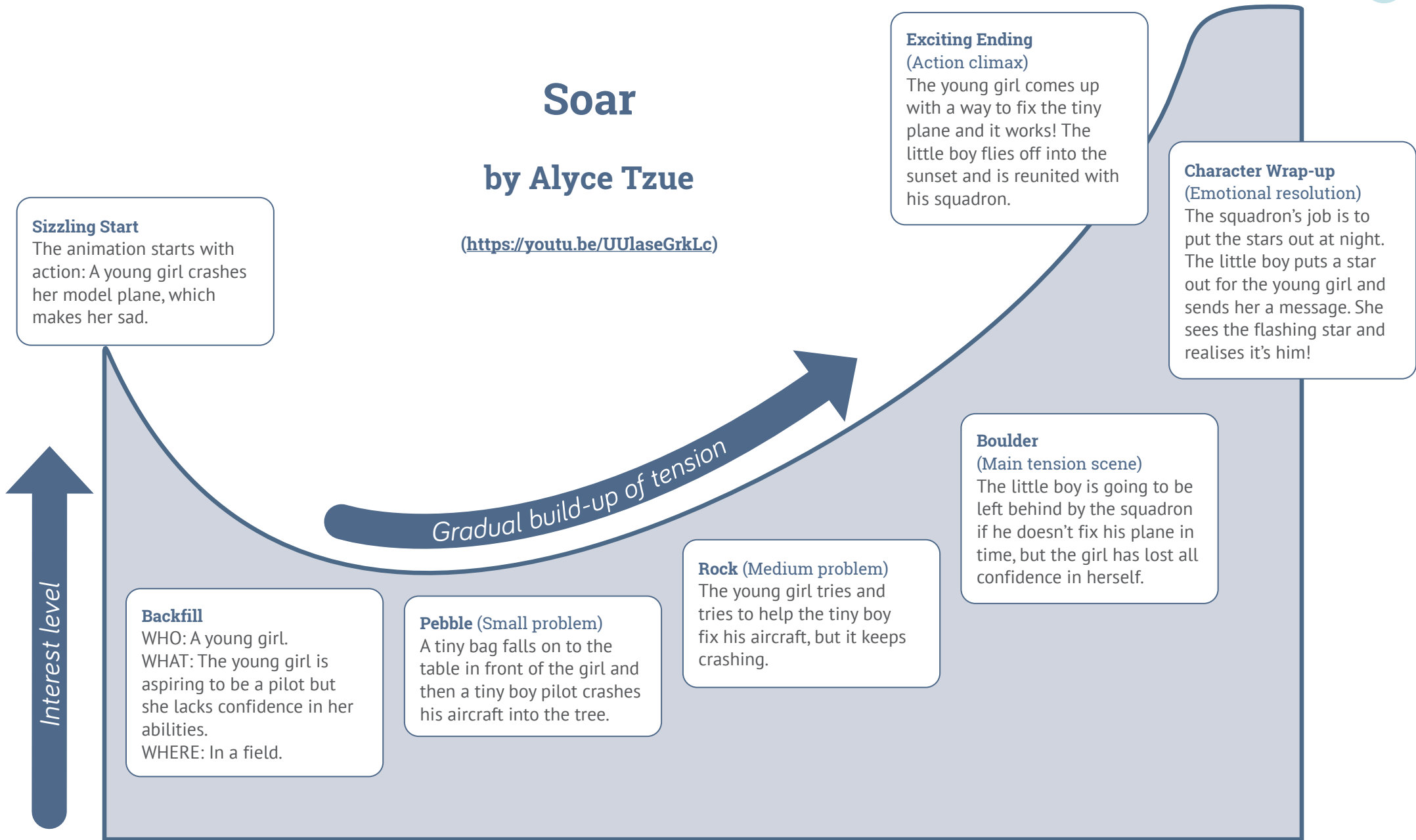
Exciting Ending (Action climax)
Lots and lots of people start coming up to the blind man and giving him coins. They all notice him. He can barely pick up the coins quickly enough.

Character Wrap-up (Emotional resolution)
The woman comes back. The man asks what she did to his sign. She says, 'I wrote the same – but different words.' We see the sign. It reads: 'IT'S A BEAUTIFUL DAY AND I CAN'T SEE IT.'

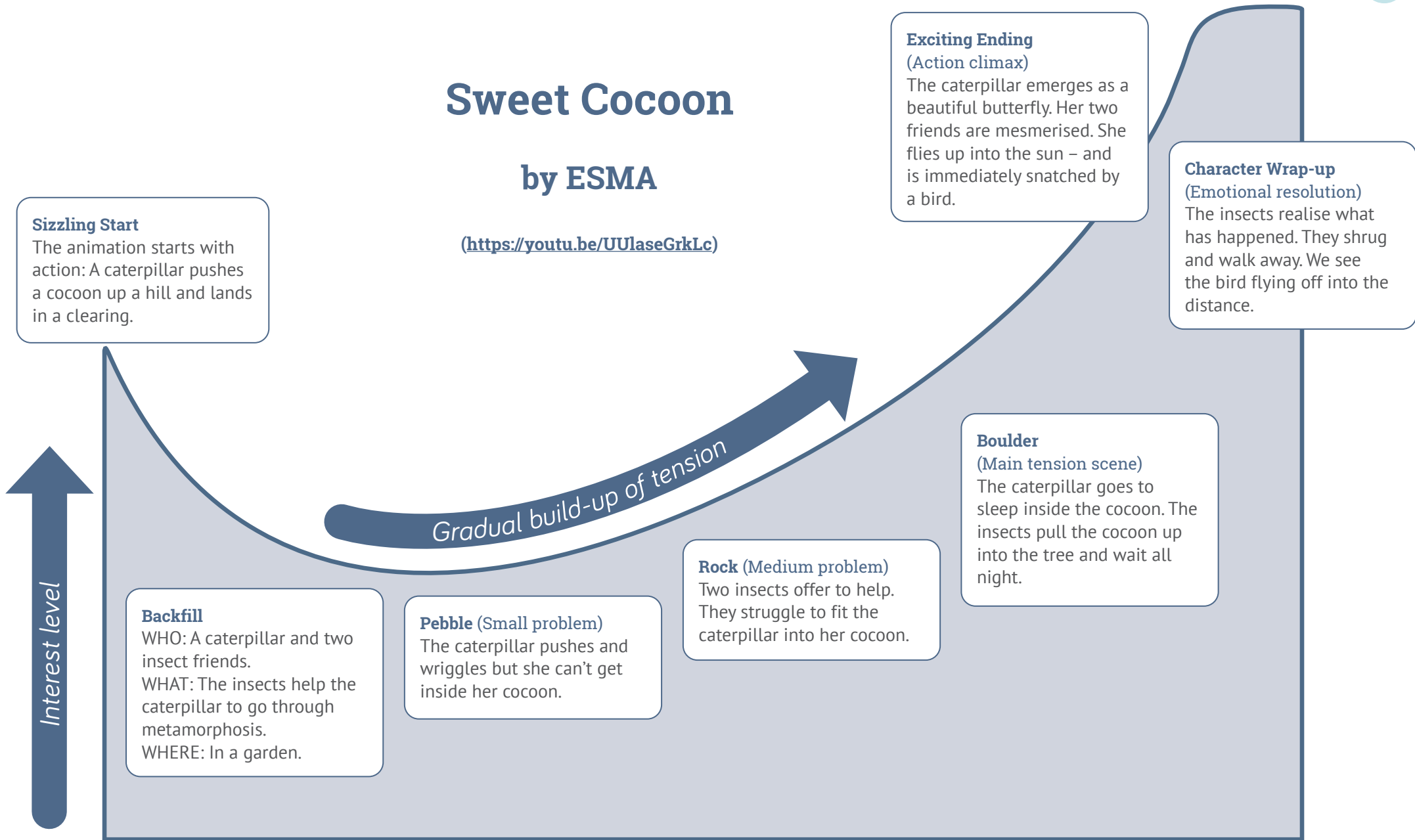

Sweet Cocoon

Sizzling Start
The animation starts with action: A caterpillar pushes a cocoon up a hill and lands in a clearing.

Backfill
WHO: A caterpillar and two insect friends.
WHAT: The insects help the caterpillar to go through metamorphosis.
WHERE: In a garden.

Pebble (Small problem)
The caterpillar pushes and wriggles but she can't get inside her cocoon.

Rock (Medium problem)
Two insects offer to help. They struggle to fit the caterpillar into her cocoon.

Boulder (Main tension scene)
The caterpillar goes to sleep inside the cocoon. The insects pull the cocoon up into the tree and wait all night.

Exciting Ending (Action climax)
The caterpillar emerges as a beautiful butterfly. Her two friends are mesmerised. She flies up into the sun – and is immediately snatched by a bird.

Character Wrap-up (Emotional resolution)
The insects realise what has happened. They shrug and walk away. We see the bird flying off into the distance.
