There are many more sets of story graphs available, covering books with themes from friendship and belonging to sustainability and First Nations histories and cultures, as well as secondary texts. Members can find them on *Teacher Hub*.

# Step 1: Plan for Success Animations and Advertisements on the Story Graph

One of the best ways to learn is to see examples, like these story graphs.

### How to use them:

- Explore favourite stories and how they work
- Look for moments of tension (the pebble, rock and boulder)
- Compare the many ways stories start and end
- Inspire students to create their own story graphs!

### Boulder

(Main tension scene) The poor spider is whipped back and forth through the air as the fly tries to find a way out.



Pushing the button transports the hero into a romantic comedy and then an action movie. He drops the Plot Device and has to get it back in the middle of a police shoot-out.


## Gradual build-up of tension Rock (Medium problem)
